**Subject:** Media Update on novel H1N1 flu cases in Indiana - change in case reporting

### **Indiana: New Novel H1N1 Flu Cases Confirmed**

The Indiana State Department of Health reports nine (9) new confirmed cases of the novel H1N1 flu in the following counties: Allen (1), Lake (3), and Marion (5).

These nine new cases bring the total number of confirmed cases of the novel H1N1 flu in Indiana to 155, with the following county breakdown:

- Allen (1)
- Daviess (1)
- Elkhart (2)
- Hamilton (4)
- Hendricks (1)
- Lake (44)
- Madison (1)
- Marion (84)
- Monroe (2)
- Porter (5)
- Putnam (3)
- St. Joseph (2)
- Tippecanoe (5)

The breakdown of confirmed cases by age group (years), include:

- 0-4 (30)
- 5-24 (102)
- 25-64 (21)
- 65+ (2)

There is one newly reported hospitalization associated with the novel H1N1 influenza A virus in Indiana (total of 8 since April 20, 2009). There are currently no reported deaths associated with the novel H1N1 influenza A virus in Indiana.

**Note: After today, the Indiana State Department of Health (ISDH) will only be reporting new confirmed cases of the novel H1N1 flu once a week. Starting on Thursday, June 4 the ISDH will report any new confirmed cases after noon every Thursday. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has changed its reporting requirement for states and starting this week, the ISDH will be reporting new confirmed cases of the novel H1N1 flu to the CDC only once a week.**
